

## Message from the Chair and CEO

Dear clients, families, guardians and friends of Sunnyfield,

In 1951 Hazel and Fred Whiddon placed an advertisement in the local paper, calling together like minded parents of children with intellectual disability, to work together to create better lives for their children. Their son Trevor was born with an intellectual disability and they were determined he would have a good life like his brother Bryan.

So, on what was to be a momentous occasion, five women – Mrs Astley, Mrs O'Donoghue, Mrs Sproston, Mrs Piggott and Mrs Roberts – came to Mrs Whiddon's house in October 1951 to discuss the possibility of the formation of an association and of starting some sort of training program for their own children and any others in the area.

At the inaugural meeting on 17 March 1952, at the home of Mrs Cooper, 18 people met and formed an autonomous body to be known as The Manly Sunnyfield Association. Sunnyfield Members (today over 500 family relatives) worked tirelessly to raise funds and build on their forefathers dedication and sacrifice, to grow services during a time when little if any government funding was available.

Our deepest respect and appreciation goes out to the clients, families and customers who have generously made Sunnyfield what it is today. It hasn't been easy at times, forever trying to secure more funds to undertake our mission, fundraising, accessing land, building facilities and championing our vision.

What was created at that time, and remains true

to this day, is an overwhelming commitment by passionate people to a shared vision and mission, with united values that have guided us through the last 70 years, and will continue to, into the future. We always have, and always will, put clients at the forefront of everything we do, working in collaboration with families and the person's circle of support, to help them live the life they choose.

Key to Sunnyfield's success has and continues to be the passion, commitment, creativity, flexibility, dedication and hard work of every person that works at Sunnyfield. It is an honor and privilege to work alongside such an inspiring group of people.

# THE SUNNYFIELD WAY For a brighter future
























